Questions of age and ageing have become increasingly central in political, social, academic and aesthetic discourses and areas of activity. We therefore invite scholars of all disciplines to inquire into the interconnections of gender, generation and ageing and the resulting conflict potential from historical, contemporary and comparative cultural perspectives. Possible topics include:

Age(ing) and gender

- Age(ing) as a social and cultural construct
- Life course and gender
- Social norms of interaction with ageing people and gender differentials
- Gender and age conventions of linguistic representation
- Family (hi)stories and family relations

Age-specific ways of life, self-image and gender

- Gender- and age-specific ways of life and social change
- Gender- and age-specific language and communication processes

Forms and experiences of life-long learning

Generational and familial relations and gender

- Expressions and deficits of inter-generationality such as generational conflict and age discrimination
- Historical/cultural variability in social perceptions of 'generation'
- Scholarly discourses on intergenerational relationships and demographic change
- Reflection on life experience as an influence on inter-gender and inter-generational relationships

Gender, generation and age(ing) in art, literature and the media Comparative perspectives on cultures

- Culture-specific and socially specific patterns of gender, generation and age(ing)
- International perspectives on social policy
