The processes of globalization in all social, economic and political areas are increasingly accompanied by worldwide migratory movements. In Germany, as in other countries, the proportion of the population with a migration background has been growing, with a wide range of motives for emigration or immigration at work. Social multiculturalism and the everyday contact between cultures with different histories, traditions and ideas of integration pose a challenge to every society. The question if and how the individual lives that have been shaped by migration show gender-specific variation is particularly interesting for research.

Therefore we invite scholars of all academic disciplines to present current research on the interrelations between gender, migration and life courses. Papers may address these issues from historical as well as contemporary, and national as well as transnational and comparative perspectives.
